

ARE YOU LEAVING THE MANIILAQ SERVICE AREA?



Because travel increases your chances of getting infected and spreading COVID-19, staying home is the best way to protect yourself and others from getting sick.

If you are thinking about traveling away from your local community, ask:

Is COVID-19 spreading where you're going?

You can get infected while traveling.

Is COVID-19 spreading in your community?

Even if you don't have symptoms, you can spread COVID-19 to others while traveling.

Will you or those you are traveling with be within 6 feet of others during or after your trip?

Being within 6 feet of others increases your chances of getting infected and infecting others.

Are you or your loved ones more likely to get very ill from COVID-19?

Individuals who have an increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19 should limit their travel. If you get infected while traveling you can spread COVID-19 to loved ones when you return, even if you don't have symptoms.

Have you checked what local mandates your community has upon your return?

Most local governments in the Maniilaq service area have stricter mandates than the State of Alaska. Please respect local mandates that are in place.

Remember to: wear a mask, limit contact with non-household members, avoid contact with others, wash your hands often, cover coughs and sneezes, avoid touching your face, and pick up your food instead of dining in restaurants.

It is recommended individuals get tested within 72 hours of your arrival into the Maniilaq service area.

Do not travel if you are sick, or if you have been around someone with COVID-19 in the past 14 days. Do not travel with someone who is sick.
