Thirty-Five Maniilaq Service Area Residents Test Positive for COVID-19

August 25, 2021, 12:30 pm – Two Noatak residents tested positive for COVID-19 outside of the Maniilaq service area. One tested positive on August 20th and the other on the 22nd. The individuals have mild symptoms and are not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation outside of the Maniilaq service area and departed the region more than two weeks before testing positive.

A Noatak resident tested positive for COVID-19 on August 21st at Red Dog Mine. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation at the mine.

Two Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on August 22nd outside of the Maniilaq service area. The individuals have mild symptoms and are not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation outside of the Maniilaq service area and departed the region two weeks before testing positive.

A Noatak resident tested positive for COVID-19 on August 22nd in Noatak. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noatak.

Six Noatak residents tested positive for COVID-19 on August 23rd in Noatak. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noatak.

Three Kotzebue residents tested positive for COVID-19 on August 23rd in Kotzebue. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Point Hope resident tested positive for COVID-19 on August 23rd in Kotzebue. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue and departed the region more than two weeks before testing positive.

A Noorvik resident tested positive for COVID-19 on August 23rd in Noorvik. The individual is asymptomatic and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noorvik.

Eighteen Noatak residents tested positive for COVID-19 on August 24th in Kotzebue (5) and Noatak (13). The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue and Noatak.

While some communities throughout the Maniilaq service area may not have *known* active positive COVID-19 cases currently, it is important to continue to stay vigilant and follow recommended preventative measures.

The following symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Please follow the health mandates put in place by your community. It is important you are not actively out in the community during the quarantine period put in place by your community.
