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Forty-Nine Maniilaq Service Area Residents Test Positive for COVID-19

September 13, 2021, 8:30 am – A Noatak resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 3rd while outside of the Maniilaq service area (MSA). The individual has mild symptoms and is not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation outside of the MSA and have been out of the region for more than two weeks.

Seven Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on September 9th in Point Hope. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Point Hope.

A Deering resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Deering. The individual is asymptomatic and is not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Deering.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Kotzebue. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

Two Kiana residents tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Kotzebue. The individuals are asymptomatic and are not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue and had been out of the region for one week.

Four Noatak residents tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Noatak. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noatak.

Eight Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Point Hope. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Point Hope.

A Point Hope resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th while outside of the MSA. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to community spread. They are in isolation outside of the MSA and have been out of the region for more than two weeks.

A Noorvik resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 10th in Noorvik. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noorvik.

A Buckland resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 11th in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and is not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue and had been out of the region less than one week.

A Noorvik resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 11th in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and is not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue and had been out of the region for less than one week.

Eighteen Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on September 11th in Point Hope. The individuals have mild symptoms and are linked to community spread. They are in isolation in Point Hope.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 11th in Kotzebue. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Point Hope resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 12th in Point Hope. The individual has mild symptoms and is linked to community spread. They are in isolation in Point Hope.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on September 12th in Kotzebue. The individual has mild symptoms and is not linked to a known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

While some communities throughout the Maniilaq service area may not have *known* active positive COVID-19 cases currently, it is important to continue to stay vigilant and follow recommended preventative measures.

We need your help in keeping the case count low. We all play a part in keeping our loved ones safe. **The power of simple tools such as getting vaccinated, social distancing, avoiding gatherings, wearing a mask and hand washing make a difference.**

Maniilaq Public Health Nursing is working with the State to conduct contact tracing and will reach out to anyone who may have come into significant contact with these cases. If residents believe they have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever and symptoms, such as a dry cough or difficulty breathing, call your healthcare provider for medical advice or call Maniilaq's COVID-19 Hotline at 833-442-7015. The following symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Please follow the health mandates put in place by your community. It is important you are not actively out in the community during the quarantine period put in place by your community.
