- 1. If you are positive and interested in a Monoclonal Antibody Infusion
 - Call 907-442-7047 between the hours of 8am-5pm M-F.
 - Call the ER at 907-442-7202 After 5pm and on weekends
- 2. When you call you will need to provide the following information to assist in determining your eligibility for the infusion:

Name Date of Birth Date of your positive test Symptoms

- 3. This information will be forwarded to our respiratory provider to determine your eligibility for the infusion.
- 4. What should you expect after you call?
 - Your request will be forwarded immediately and you will receive a call back from the provider the same day.
 - The provider will inform you if you meet eligibility requirements.
 - An infusion team nurse will call you if you are eligible to set up your infusion appointment.
 - Infusion appointments are made <u>within 24 hours</u> if you are in Kotzebue and within <u>1-2 days if you are in a village</u> (to accommodate transportation to your community to provide the infusion).

What to Expect When Getting an Infusion

- 1. IV access is required.
- 2. The medication is infused over 1 hour.
- 3. You will need to plan to stay for 1 hour after your infusion to be observed to ensure your safety.
- 4. You may bring a book, device, or laptop as desired.
- 5. You will be in a comfortable isolated area to limit contact and contamination.
- 6. If you live in a village the infusion nurse will care for you in your CHAP Clinic.
- 7. Know that the infusion nurse is fully trained to give this medication and to assess you for any adverse reactions.
- 8. The infusion nurse will have medications available for any signs of an allergic reaction.
- 9. After completion of your infusion and 1-hour observation period the IV will be removed and you will be free to return to your quarantine site.
- 10. The infusion is available to anyone 10 years and older who meet current manufacturer approved criteria.
