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46 Maniilaq Service Area Residents & 1 Non-Resident Test Positive for COVID-19

March 28, 2022, 11:15am- **A non-resident** tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

Seven Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Point Hope. Some have mild symptoms, while others are asymptomatic, linked to known positive COVID-19 case, and community spread. They are in isolation in Point Hope.

Two Noatak residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Anchorage. The individuals are asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Anchorage.

A Noatak resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Noatak. The individual has mild symptoms and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Noatak.

Three Deering residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Deering. The individuals have mild symptoms, and linked to community spread. They are in isolation in Deering.

A Selawik resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Selawik. The individual has mild symptoms and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Selawik.

Four Buckland residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Buckland. Some have mild symptoms, while others are asymptomatic, linked to known positive COVID-19 case, and community spread. They are in isolation in Buckland.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 24, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

An Ambler resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 25, 2022 in Anchorage. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Anchorage.

Eleven Buckland residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 25, 2022 in Buckland. Some have mild symptoms, while others are asymptomatic, linked to known positive COVID-19 case, and community spread. They are in isolation in Buckland.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 25, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Deering resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 25, 2022 in Deering. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Deering.

Two Point Hope residents tested positive for COVID-19 on March 25, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individuals have mild symptoms, and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Kotzebue resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 26, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual has mild symptoms and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Point Hope resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 27, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

A Selawik resident tested positive for COVID-19 on March 27, 2022 in Kotzebue. The individual is asymptomatic and not linked to known positive COVID-19 case. They are in isolation in Kotzebue.

While some communities throughout the Maniilaq service area may not have *known* active positive COVID-19 cases currently, it is important to continue to stay vigilant and follow recommended preventative measures.

We need your help in slowing the spread. We all play a part in keeping our loved ones safe. **The power of simple tools such as getting vaccinated, social distancing, avoiding gatherings, wearing a mask and hand washing make a difference.**

Maniilaq Public Health Nursing is working with the State to conduct contact tracing and will reach out to anyone who may have come into significant contact with these cases. If residents believe they have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever and symptoms, such as a dry cough or difficulty breathing, call your healthcare provider for medical advice or call Maniilaq's COVID-19 Hotline at 833-442-7015. The following symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Please follow the health mandates put in place by your community. It is important you are not actively out in the community during the quarantine period put in place by your community.
