PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Fall injuries are the leading cause of injury-related hospitalizations in the NW Arctic. Elders are particularly at risk of falling in the home and on the ice. However, fall injuries are preventable. Learn how you can reduce your risk this winter!

Fall Prevention

Some people are more likely to fall than others. The following factors increase fall risk:

- Individuals with poor strength or balance
- Clutter and other hazards at home
- Some medications with side effects that disrupt balance
- Fear of falling

Reduce your risk of falling by...

- Wearing ice cleats when outdoors in the winter.
- Exercising regularly to increase strength and balance.
- Removing fall hazards from your home such as objects on the floor, slippery tub or shower floors, unsecured rugs, and storing items in hard to reach places.
- Speaking with a provider to discuss other ways that you can reduce your fall risk.

ATV & SNOW MACHINE SAFETY

Our favorite way of travelling can also be the most dangerous; Alaska has one of the highest number of people who experience a traumatic brain injury in the nation. Wearing a helmet is the best way to prevent your brain from lifelong injury.

Brain Injury Prevention

What is a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)?

- A TBI is a head injury that causes severe damage to the brain.
- TBIs can impact a person's whole life and stop them from doing the activities that they love.
- The trauma of TBIs can affect friends, family, and other community members.

Does my helmet fit correctly?

- A properly fit helmet is the best way to prevent a TBI.
- Use a measuring tape to measure around your head.
- Then use the sizing chart for your helmet's brand to determine what size is appropriate for you.
- Shake your head up-and-down, then side-to-side. If you feel the helmet moving along your head, the helmet is too big.

Firearms help us maintain our traditional, subsistence lifestyles. However, to protect our ways, we also have to protect our community from injuries. There are many steps that you can take to ensure your friends and family are safe when hunting.

Personal Location Devices

Give you and your loved ones peace of mind and safety with a Personal Location Device.

Garmin inReach includes...

- Send text messages to cellphones
- Get help when you need it with SOS calls to the search and rescue team
- Find shelter before the storm with weather forecasts
- Keep track of your location and share it with others at home
- Note: this device requires a Garmin subscription

Firearm Safety

Gun Storage Checklist:

- ☐ Unload the firearm of all ammo.
- Lock the trigger with a trigger lock to prevent quick access to firearms.
- ☐ Store firearms in a locked cabinet.
- ☐ Store ammo in a locked container, separate from the firearms.
- ☐ Keep the keys away from children.

Why is firearm safety important?

- Reducing the time that it takes for a person to access and fire a gun can reduce the risk of intentional firearm injuries.
- It should take at least 10 min. to access and fire your gun.

Be prepared for emergencies and injuries with safety essentials!

First aid kit includes...

- Medication: ibuprofen, aspirin, benadryl, and tylenol
- Blister care: moleskin and alcohol swabs

BOATING SAFETY

Boating is an essential part of our life in the NW Arctic. However, the state of Alaska has one of the highest non-commercial boating fatality rates in the nation. Fatalities and injuries can be easily prevented with personal flotation devices.

Life Jackets

Did you know...

- Boaters are required by law to have life jackets on board for each person on the boat
- Children younger than 14 years are required by law to wear a life jacket while on board.

Does my life jacket fit correctly?

- The inside of your life jacket will indicate the size and weight limits.
- Buckle all the straps and tighten them until the jacket is snug around you. If the buckles don't close, it is too small.
- Once buckled and tightened, have a friend pull upwards gently from the shoulder straps. If the vest touches your ears, it is too big.

Float Coats

Float coats are perfect for early and later season boating. They keep you both warm and safe!

Does my float coat fit correctly?

- Unlike life jackets, the fit of you coat depends on your own comfort preferences and height.
- Most float coats are made to hold a weight of 90 lbs. and over.

- Are only recommended for swimmers.
- Automatically inflate once the person wearing it falls into the water.
- Must be rearmed after inflation with a rearming kit.
