The purpose of the program(s) is to provide access to educational opportunities that results in student's certification of either: Emergency Trauma Technician (ETT); or Emergency Medical Technician 1 (EMT1). The courses are structured congruently (at the same time) to allow for interactions and development of leadership skills for perspective EMTs and the dynamics of teamwork between ETT and EMT1 students. These courses are open to all community members 18 years of age and older as well as Maniilaq employees.

Students with <u>existing ETT certifications will be eligible to attend the EMT1 Bridge</u> course scheduled from 01/15/2024 through 02/14/24. *See the 'EMT1 Bridge Course Schedule' attached to this application for days and hours of classes. There is a total of 96 hours of instruction offered and students must attend a minimum of 84 hours to be eligible for certification and testing. Students are encouraged to attend all instructional hours for the greatest opportunity for success. Note: Required homework or practice may be assigned outside of scheduled class hours.

The State of Alaska regulates the licensure and eligibility of person(s) applying for EMT1. Conviction of 'barrier crimes' may prevent state licensure and be identified during application to the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS). For further information please contact the instructor.

Students with <u>no-existing certifications are eligible to attend the Emergency Trauma Technician</u> course (ETT) scheduled January 15th-17th & February 12th- 14th (students must attend both sessions). *See the 'Emergency Trauma Technician Course Schedule' attached to this application for days and hours of classes. ETT students will work in collaboration with the EMT1 students in skills and scenarios while in person. Note: Required homework or practice may be assigned outside of scheduled class hours.

Lodging accommodations will be arranged for all students in Kotzebue during the scheduled days of class. If students do not attend scheduled days of class time in Kotzebue their lodging will be terminated by 8am of the next day; or by discretion of the EMS/Workforce Development Program Manager(s) and Administration. The only exception is with prior authorization by course instructor(s). Instructor(s) contact information is available on the attached course syllabus.

Flights to and from villages, and meals will be provided for students. There is a \$100.00 per day meal allowance that can be charged to the hotel room at Nullagvik for non-Maniilaq employees. Maniilaq employees will receive their regular per diem rate in Kotzebue. Meal and lodging benefits will be revoked for gross misconduct or dismissal for any reason by students.*See Student Code of Conduct.

Class size is limited to a combined (ETT & EMT1) size of 12 students. If your application is received on time but we are unable to offer you a spot in class due to the volume of applications, your application will be kept and considered in future courses that may be offered. Selection of applications will be made to balance both ETT applications and EMT1 applications (6 students each). To be eligible for this program you must live in the Maniilaq Service Area.

Student Expectations and Code of Conduct for EMS Course

Purpose: This document sets forth the expectations and guidelines for students participating in the EMS course. It is designed to promote a positive learning environment, professionalism, and safety while ensuring that all students have the opportunity to excel.

Student Expectations for Attitude and Engagement:

Positive Attitude:

- Approach the course with a positive and constructive attitude.
- Foster a culture of respect, support, and collaboration among your peers.

Engagement:

- Attend all classes and practical sessions as scheduled.
- Actively participate in class discussions, exercises, and skill demonstrations.
- Ask questions, seek clarification, and contribute to the learning process.

Mentoring and Support:

- Be open to mentoring from instructors and experienced peers.
- Offer assistance and support to fellow students when needed.
- Foster an atmosphere of learning and growth for all.

• Safety Awareness:

- Prioritize safety at all times, both for yourself and others.
- Follow safety protocols, including proper use of equipment and infection control measures.

Professionalism:

- Maintain a high level of professionalism, including punctuality.
- Uphold ethical and legal standards and practice confidentiality.

(Continued) Student Expectations and Code of Conduct for EMS Course

Reasons for Dismissal:

- 1. Academic Dishonesty:
 - Plagiarism, cheating, or any form of academic dishonesty will not be tolerated.
- 2. Disruptive Behavior:
 - Disruptive behavior that negatively impacts the learning environment or the safety of others.
- 3. Non-Compliance with Safety Protocols:
 - Repeated failure to follow safety guidelines and protocols.
- 4. Unprofessional Conduct:
 - Repeated unprofessional behavior, including harassment, discrimination, or inappropriate conduct.
- 5. Excessive Absences:
 - Unexcused or excessive absences from class, lectures or practical sessions.

Discipline:

- In the event of a violation of the Code of Conduct, any of the following steps will be taken:
 - Verbal warning and counseling with the student.
 - Written warning with a specific action plan for improvement.
 - Disqualification and dismissal from the course.

Upon dismissal student's housing and meal allowance will be terminated no later than 8am of the next day. Students who are dismissed from a course will not be eligible for future courses. This code of conduct extends beyond the classroom and is in effect for the duration of the course. Violation of hotel rules are grounds for dismissal and students should be advised there is no alcohol on the premises.
